## Mom: Man charged in killings 'didn't know anything'

VINITA – A woman says the man charged in the 1999 deaths of an Oklahoma couple and the disappearance of her teenage daughter and a friend "didn't know anything" about where the missing girls are.

Lorene Bible questioned 66-year-old Ronnie Dean Busick Thursday at the Craig County jail. Busick was charged Monday with four counts of first-degree murder in the killings of Danny and Kathy Freeman, their daughter Ashley Freeman and Bible's daughter, Lauria.

Danny and Kathy Freeman were shot in the head and their bodies were left in their burning home in northeastern Oklahoma, near the Kansas border. Investigators believe the teens were killed later, but their bodies haven't been found.

The Tulsa World reports Bible told Busick she was speaking to him to find her daughter, not to attack him.

# Oklahoma gains 6 rigs as US rig count rises to 1,021

HOUSTON - The number of rigs exploring for oil and natural gas in the U.S. increased by eight this week to 1,021.

At this time a year ago there were 870 active rigs.

# Raising awareness about plastic bag recycling Submitted

In the United States, approximately 100 billion single-use plastic bags are used each year. Of that, merely 3 percent is recycled and 50 million end up as litter nationwide, according to the US EPA. To raise awareness about plastic litter, the 2018 theme of World Earth Day is "End Plastic Pol-

lution." Plastic bags and films must be recycled separately from other materials because they jam typical recycling machinery. Therefore, they should not go into your recycle cart or campus recycle bin. While plastic bags cannot be recycled along with rigid plastics, such as beverage containers, they can be recycled separately with certain local merchants.

In Stillwater, the most common place to return single-use plastic bags is to your grocer. All three Walmart locations accept plastic bags in bins located at each of the front entrances. At Sprouts on 6th Avenue, there is a plastic bag recycle bin near the front desk and at Food Pyramid, located on Main Street, the recycle bin is in the foyer. Lowe's also accepts plastic bags for recycling in its foyer.

Stillwater residents may be wondering if these plastic bags are recycled or trashed. The bags are indeed recycled and many are transformed into other products, however, each merchant uses a different method to send collected bags and plastic films to recycle processors.

Wal-Mart bales its cardboard and plastic bags and a private hauling company gathers

year. The company also has a zero-waste goal.

Food Pyramid bales cardboard and plastic bags together as well. A private packaging company collects the bales and takes them to a recycling center in Oklahoma City where the cardboard and plastic bags are separated. The cardboard is re-baled and shipped to a paper mill in Lawton, OK to be manufactured into new cardboard and the plastic bags are recycled into new bags that are used in the OKC area.

Sprouts, which also has its own baling machine, ships baled plastic bags and films to a recycling firm in Winchester, Virginia. The firm turns the plastic bags into faux-wood decking. Sprouts offers five cents off the total grocery bill for every reused bag utilized during a visit to their store.

When recycling grocery bags, make sure to remove receipts and other items. Although recycling plastic bags is better than landfilling them, reusing bags as many times as possible also extends their utility. Disposable single-use bags, however, cannot be reused repeatedly. The best option is to invest in durable bags that can be cleaned and reused indefinitely. Finally, imagine our watersheds without plastic litter as a way to help you remember to shop with your new durable bags.
